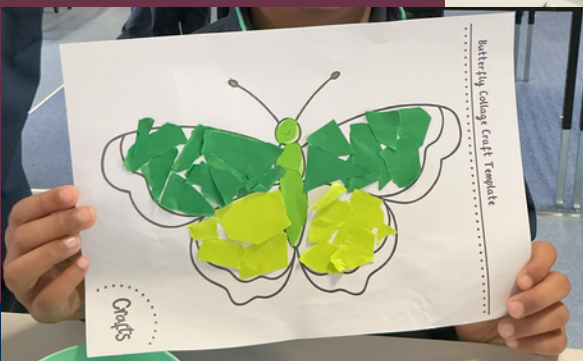
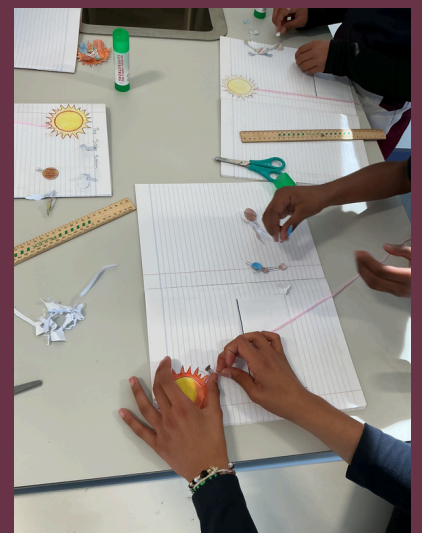
In the science classroom this term:

Grade 3/4 students have been learning about the water cycle.

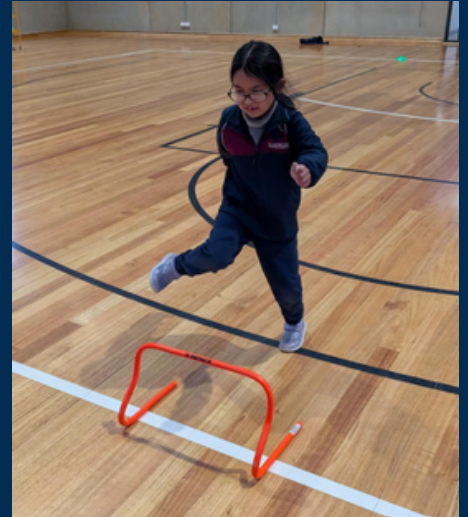
And Grade 5/6 students have been learning about the Earth in space.
